



DISTRACTION ISN'T JUST DANGEROUS, IT CAN BE DEADLY

In New Jersey, from 2011 through 2020:



More than half of all crashes and a third of fatal crashes involved a distracted driver.



43 percent of pedestrian-involved crashes also involved a distracted driver.



NJ law prohibits the use of cellphones while driving. Fines can range from \$200 to \$800 and up to a 90-day license suspension.
